Truck maintenance - 518 (IH brush truck) required a battery replacement

516 (Dodge brush truck) is nearly completed, has been operational for some time, but has recently received a relief valve and still has a couple reels to be plumbed. Biggest item left is door lettering, that has become quite expensive for the style of letters we typically use, but is none the less necessary.

Building and grounds maintainence:

A laid off firefighter (plumber) repaired a slow drain that has been a long standing problem.

Maple tree on south side of station was found to be putting roots again our well housing, cracking it. The tree was removed recently and very shortly will be completely cleaned up, including grinding out stump and seeding the lawn.
